

Roulette

Roulette is one of the most popular and exciting casino games mainly, due to its simplicity. Pick a series of numbers: birthdays, anniversaries, childrens ages, place your chips, and watch the ball drop into your number in the wheel to win.

How to play?

American Roulette has 37 numbers, 0-36. They alternate around the wheel red and black, although 0 is green. All dozen bets will lose if 0 is the winning number. The payout on 0 is the same as any other number except the even chance bets which will be halved.

Stakes and Odds

- Straight up,**
covers one number 35-1
- Split,**
covers two numbers, pays 17-1
- Street,**
covers three numbers, pays 11-1
- Corner,**
covers four numbers, pays 8-1
- Six-Line,**
covers six numbers, pays 5-1
- Dozen,**
covers twelve numbers (25 to 36), pays 2-1
- Column,**
covers twelve numbers
(2,5,8,11,14,17,20,23,26,29,32,35), pays 2-1
- Even Chance,**
covers eighteen numbers, pays 1-1

Blackjack

A little more skill comes into the game of Blackjack, from the original two cards to as many as you can draw without going over 21...and that's where the luck comes in. If you've played 21 or Pontoon before, you'll know where to stand.

How to play?

The aim is to have cards that add up to 21 without going over.

Face cards - Kings, Queens and Jacks count as 10.

Aces 1 or 11, whichever suits your hand.

The Pay-out

1-1 i.e. you win the same number of chips you bet except for 'Blackjack', an ace and face card, which pays 3-2 unless the dealer also has blackjack.

The Game

Players place their bets and are dealt two cards face up and dealer one.

Players can take additional cards before the dealer takes his/her second.

- 1. If you don't go over 21 and the dealer does you win.*
- 2. If you don't go over 21 and the dealer doesn't, the person closest to 21 wins. The dealer has to take an extra card when he/she has 16 or less, and must stand on 17 or more.*
- 3. If you have the same, the deal is a draw and your bet stands.*
- 4. If you go over 21 and the dealer also goes over 21, you lose.*
- 5. If the first two cards you are dealt are the same (except for 4's, 5's or 10's) you are allowed to split them and play two hands, but if they are aces you will receive only one more card on each.*
- 6. You can double your bet if your first two cards total 9, 10 or 11 without an ace, and you will receive one card only.*
